POSITION: Occupational Therapist Registered/Licensed

PROGRAM: School Clinic Program

WHEN: Immediate

HOURS: 22.5 hours per week; 10 Month School Calendar PLUS 6-week Summer School Program

DESCRIPTION: Under the supervision of the Program Director is responsible for planning and delivering OT services to students of the School Program.

RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Screen and assess individual strengths and weaknesses using formal and informal tools.
- Administer re-evaluation testing for the children and semi-annual testing for adults.
- Evaluate intake students when referred.
- Develop goals/objectives in conjunction with educational/vocational goals and parent/guardian input.
- Recommend program materials and adaptive equipment for individual use.
- Recommend changes in student level of services.
- Prepare therapy sessions, therapeutic material and equipment orders, adapts, or makes curriculum materials appropriate for the needs of a specific student or class.
- Maintain and organize the therapy area.
- Remain current with latest developments in Occupational Therapy via membership in National or State Associations and/or reading of journals and other media.
- Provide individual and small group treatment within the classroom, community, work area, therapy room or immediate environment of Holy Childhood.
- Implement treatment plan and educational objectives.
- Complete daily progress notes and billing records accurately within required time frame.
- Prepare for semi-annual case reviews as needed and submits quarterly reports.
- Submit goals and objectives for annual Committee or Special Education meetings.
- Attend and participate in case reviews, parent conferences, and other scheduled student/individual meetings. Discusses changes in therapy program with team and parents/guardians.
- Meet with team members regarding group or classroom-based therapy to ensure role clarification and maximize student participation.
- Supervise certified occupational therapy assistant (COTA) as outlined by American Occupational Therapy Association guidelines and in compliance with Medicaid and NYSED requirements
- Supervise student interns as scheduled and maintain contact with education site.
- Participates in off-campus meetings when requested.
- Provides in-service assistance to staff.
- Demonstrate sensitivity to and respect for the diverse cultural backgrounds and practices of the students, staff and families of Holy Childhood

QUALIFICATIONS:

The Occupational Therapist is required to have at least a Bachelors Degree in Occupational Therapy and be licensed by the State of New York as well as certified by the National Board of Certification in Occupational Therapy (NBCOT).
